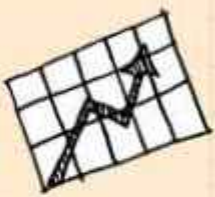
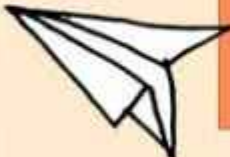

YOUTH:

The Architects of India's Future



National Youth Day, observed on 12 January to mark the birth anniversary of Swami Vivekananda, is more than a tribute—it is a reaffirmation of India's faith in its youth. As the country advances towards the centenary of Independence in 2047, young Indians stand at the centre of this transformation. With over 65% of the population below 35 years, India's demographic dividend is not merely an advantage—it is India's defining strength on the road to Viksit Bharat @2047.

Over the last decade, a sustained governance focus on youth-led development—anchored in the Prime Minister's emphasis on confidence, capability and opportunity—has helped create a national ecosystem where young citizens are not just beneficiaries of schemes, but active partners in nation-building.

From Participation to Partnership: Young Indians Are Shaping Governance

At the heart of youth engagement is Mera Yuva Bharat (MY Bharat)—a technology-driven platform under the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports connecting youth with opportunities for volunteering, leadership, skilling and experiential learning.

Key impact highlights:

- » 2.05 crore youth registered on MY Bharat portal (as of 26 Nov 2025)
- » 14.5 lakh+ volunteering opportunities generated
- » 16,000+ youth clubs and 60,000+ institutional partners onboarded

- » MY Bharat Mobile App launched (1 Oct 2025) with multilingual support, AI chatbots, voice navigation, Smart CV Builder, and digital certificates

Designed to be a digital gateway for "Yuva Shakti se Jan Bhagidari", MY Bharat reflects the push towards a more participatory governance model—where youth energy is systematically channelled into community impact and nation-building outcomes.

Nation-Building Beyond the Classroom

Youth leadership in India has long been rooted in service. The National Service Scheme (NSS), operational since 1969, today engages over 39 lakh volunteers annually across

From National Integration Camps to Republic Day Parade Camps, NSS continues to build social responsibility, unity and grassroots participation—values central to Swami Vivekananda's ideals and India's national aspirations.

Skilling the Youth, Strengthening the Economy

India's skilling architecture has expanded substantially, built around the idea that employability, entrepreneurship and global competitiveness begin with future-ready skills. 6+ crore Indians have been empowered since 2014 under skilling and entrepreneurship interventions.

The Startup India Initiative has completed a defining decade. Launched in 2016 as a policy-driven effort to energise entrepreneurship, Startup India has evolved into one of the world's largest and most diverse startup ecosystems, shaping India's economic transformation and reinforcing the national vision of Viksit Bharat 2047.

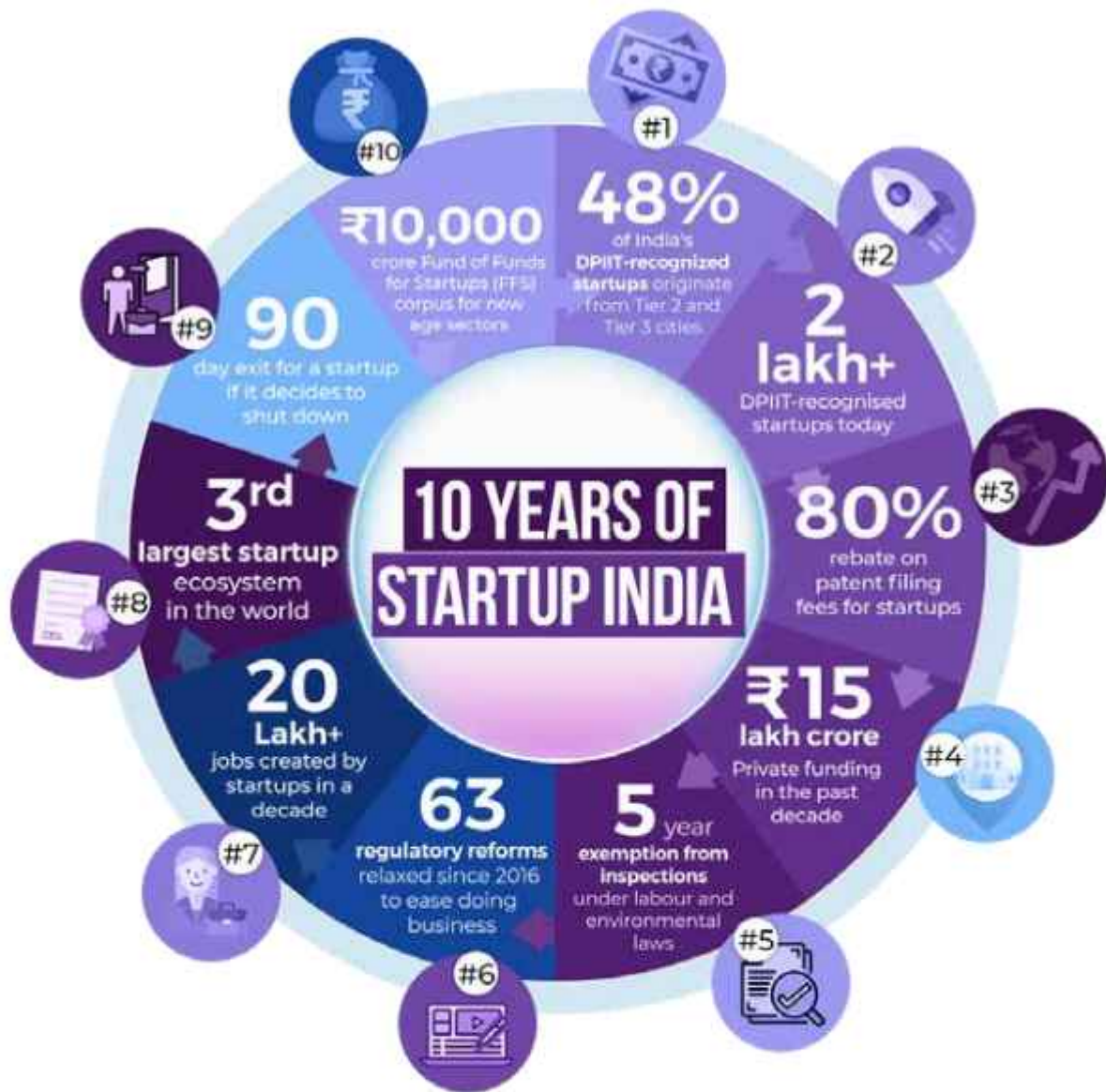
What began as an enabling framework has today become a full-spectrum ecosystem—spanning funding, mentorship, innovation infrastructure, regulatory reforms and global integration—positioning startups as a central pillar of India's growth story.

Startups at the Core of Economic Transformation

Over the past decade, startups have emerged as powerful engines of innovation, employment and inclusion.

- » Over 2 lakh startups recognised as of December 2025
- » Nearly 50% of startups from Tier II and Tier III cities, signalling the democratisation of entrepreneurship
- » More than 48% of recognised startups have at least one woman Director/ Partner, strengthening inclusive growth

Startups today are driving solutions across agri-tech, clean mobility, fintech, healthtech, tourism, ed-tech and digital public infrastructure, helping bridge rural-urban divides while unlocking productivity gains across sectors.



From Four Unicorns to a Global Powerhouse

India's startup ecosystem has undergone a remarkable scale-up:

SOMNATH SWABHIMAN PARV

Remembering a Millennium of Resilience

The Somnath Swabhimani Parv (8–11 January 2026) marked two significant milestones in India's civilisational journey—1,000 years since the first recorded attack on the Somnath Temple in 1026, and 75 years since its restoration in 1951 after Independence. Addressing the gathering at Prabhas Patan, Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi framed the occasion not as remembrance of destruction, but as recognition of an unbroken cultural resolve.



Ghazni to later invaders—each followed by reconstruction through the devotion of communities and leaders such as King Kumarapala, Ahilyabai Holkar, and finally Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel, whose resolve led to the reopening of the temple in 1951 in the presence of Dr. Rajendra Prasad.

A Temple Rebuilt Across Centuries

Tracing Somnath's history, the Prime Minister recalled repeated attempts to destroy the temple—from Mahmud of

generations. Remembering the courage of ancestors, he said, strengthens national self-confidence and cultural clarity.

Vibrant Gujarat Regional Conference for Kutch and Saurashtra in Rajkot

That same continuity between heritage and the future shaped the message at the Vibrant Gujarat Regional Conference for Kutch & Saurashtra in Rajkot. Describing Vibrant Gujarat as a two-decade journey of modern India, the Prime Minister highlighted how regions once challenged by droughts and disasters are now anchors of manufacturing, MSMEs, renewable energy, ports & logistics. He underlined that Gujarat's growth—spanning industrial clusters, green energy parks, ports and skilling institutions—reflects the confidence of a nation moving steadily towards becoming the world's third-largest economy.

Release of Shrimad Vijayaratna Sunder Surishwarji Maharaj's 500th book



Completing this continuum of faith, development and values, the Prime Minister also addressed the release of Shrimad Vijayaratna Sunder Surishwarji Maharaj's 500th book through a video message. He highlighted the relevance of Jain philosophy—especially Paraspapragraho Jivanam—in a divided world. PM Modi noted that India's youth are building a developed nation while remaining rooted in ethical and cultural traditions—an alignment essential for sustainable progress.

India-Germany Engagement



PM Modi welcomed German Federal Chancellor Friedrich Merz in Ahmedabad, where both the leaders held delegation-level talks, reaffirming their shared commitment to democratic values, a rules-based international order, and a stronger India-Germany Strategic Partnership. The discussions reviewed progress across defence, trade, technology, climate action and global issues, and underscored growing momentum in bilateral cooperation.

PIPRAHWA RELICS

of Buddha Return
After 127 Years



In a moment that resonates far beyond archaeology, India reclaimed a priceless part of its civilisational soul in 2025. After remaining abroad for 127 years, the sacred Piprahwa relics of Bhagwan Buddha—among the earliest and most historically significant relics directly associated with the Buddha—returned to their rightful home. Their repatriation stands as a testament to India's growing resolve to protect its cultural heritage and honour its spiritual legacy on the global stage.

From Discovery to Displacement

Discovered in 1898 by William Claxton Peppé during excavations at Piprahwa in present-day Uttar Pradesh, the relics include sacred caskets, reliquaries, and associated objects believed to be linked to ancient Kapilavastu, where Bhagwan Buddha spent his early life.

Removed during the colonial period, the relics remained with the Peppé family in the United Kingdom for over a century—viewed abroad as antiquities, but revered in India as living symbols of faith.

A Swift, Firm and Principled Response

The turning point came in May 2025, when Sotheby's Hong Kong announced an international auction of the Piprahwa relics.

Timeline of India's intervention:

- ▶ 2 May 2025: India raised the issue diplomatically with the UK
- ▶ 5 May 2025: Legal notice issued to Sotheby's Hong Kong and Chris Peppé
- ▶ 6 May 2025: India declared the relics "not objects for sale"
- ▶ 7 May 2025: Sotheby's delayed the auction
- ▶ 12 May 2025: Scientific verification by Indian experts in Hong Kong
- ▶ 30 July 2025: Relics returned to India



Through sustained diplomatic engagement, legal action, and scientific validation, India ensured the relics were protected and repatriated—demonstrating a firm stance that cultural heritage cannot be commodified.



A Homecoming of Civilisational Significance

The return of the relics was marked by a ceremonial reception in New Delhi, achieved through an innovative public-private partnership. This historic moment was followed by the inauguration of the Grand International Exposition of Sacred Piprahwa Relics, titled "The Light & the Lotus: Relics of the Awakened One", by Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi. Addressing the gathering, the Prime Minister described the return as the restoration of India's heritage and legacy,

underscoring that what was once seen as an artefact abroad is, for India, an inseparable part of its civilisation.

TWO YEARS OF PRAN PRATISHTHA



January 22, 2024 marked a defining moment in India's civilisational journey. In Ayodhya, Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi led the Pran Pratishtha ceremony at the newly built Ram Mandir, fulfilling an aspiration cherished across generations. With the consecration of Ram Lalla, the Mandir emerged not only as a place of worship, but as a symbol of faith, continuity

and cultural resurgence. The very next day, the doors of the Mandir opened to devotees. What followed was historic. Over five lakh devotees offered darshan on the first day itself, setting the tone for an extraordinary spiritual movement. In the two years since Pran Pratishtha, more than 5.5 crore devotees from across India and the world have visited Ayodhya to seek blessings.

One of the most evocative moments came on Ram Navami, when the meticulously designed Surya Tilak illuminated Ram Lalla's forehead. Guided through mirrors and lenses, the sun's rays created a divine glow, witnessed by devotees globally, blending devotion with precision engineering.

In 2025, the installation of idols of Sita, Lakshman, Bharat, Shatrughna and Hanuman completed the Ram Darbar, enhancing the Mandir's spiritual grandeur. The journey reached its final milestone when Prime Minister Modi hoisted the Dharma Dhwaja atop the 191-foot shikhar, marking the formal completion of the Ram Mandir—an enduring symbol of faith restored and heritage renewed.

"IN INDIA, DEMOCRACY DELIVERS"

PM Modi at the 28th CSPOC



Inaugurating the 28th Conference of Speakers and Presiding Officers of the Commonwealth (CSPOC) at Samvidhan Sadan, Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi articulated India's democratic philosophy as one that combines tradition, inclusion and effective delivery. Highlighting the unique role of Speakers in a parliamentary democracy, the Prime Minister observed that their true strength lies not in speaking, but in listening with patience and ensuring every voice is heard. Addressing parliamentary leaders from across the Commonwealth, he underscored that India has transformed its vast diversity into the strength of its democracy, countering early doubts about the country's democratic viability.

"In India, democracy means last-mile delivery," the Prime Minister asserted, emphasising that democratic institutions provide stability, speed and scale. He noted that governance rooted in public welfare has enabled 25 crore people to rise out of poverty in recent years, reaffirming that "democracy delivers" when people's aspirations remain central. Drawing from India's civilisational heritage, PM Modi recalled ancient traditions of debate and consensus. As the world navigates rapid technological and social change, the Prime Minister called upon legislatures to responsibly harness AI and digital tools to strengthen transparency, inclusivity and public trust—ensuring democracy remains resilient, relevant and people-centric.

72ND NATIONAL Volleyball Tournament



India's sporting journey gained fresh momentum as Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi inaugurated the 72nd National Volleyball Tournament in Varanasi on 4 January, marking yet another step in the country's athlete-centric sports transformation. Addressing players and officials, the Prime Minister congratulated the athletes who reached the national stage through dedication and perseverance, and welcomed teams from 28 States, reflecting the spirit of Ek Bharat, Shreshtha Bharat.

Where Tradition Meets Sporting Excellence

Highlighting Varanasi's long-standing sporting culture—from wrestling and boxing to kabaddi and rowing—the Prime Minister noted that the city has consistently produced national-level athletes through institutions like Banaras Hindu University, UP College and Kashi Vidyapeeth. Hosting the national championship, he said, adds a new chapter to the city's evolving identity as a hub for major cultural and sporting events.

Describing volleyball as a sport rooted in balance, cooperation and trust, Shri Modi drew parallels between the game and India's development journey. Just as no player wins alone on the court, national progress, he said, depends on collective effort, shared responsibility and a strong India First spirit.

A Decade of Sports Reforms Bearing Fruit

The Prime Minister highlighted how a shift in mindset over the past decade—backed by increased budgets, transparent selection, scientific training and initiatives like Khelo India and TOPS—has strengthened India's sports ecosystem. With 1,000+ players across 58 teams competing till 11 January, the tournament stands as a celebration of rising confidence, infrastructure growth and India's expanding sporting ambitions.

ONE NATION, MANY HARVESTS

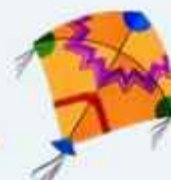
Festivals that bind India's cultural soul

India has officially launched its BRICS 2026 Chairship with the unveiling of the logo, theme and official portal, where the Namaste-inspired emblem reflects unity and dialogue and the theme "Building Resilience, Innovation, Cooperation and Sustainability" sets the direction for collaborative global engagement.
